POLICY TITLE: Early Graduation POLICY NO: 616

Any high school student who completes the number of credits and other exiting standards required by both the state and the district prior to completing eight (8) semesters of high school work may petition the superintendent and board of trustees to graduate early.

This board will permit early graduation under unusual and unique circumstances for students who would benefit from early graduation. Early graduates may participate in the regular spring commencement ceremony.

The deadline for filing an application for early graduation is November 30.

The student is required to complete the early graduation application, stating the calculated number of credits and reason for the application.

The student and parent/guardian will meet with the counselor, who will review the application and counsel the student. The counselor will determine, on the basis of credits earned, whether the student will complete the required number of semester credits and core of instruction prior to the proposed early graduation date.

The counselor will inform the principal of the request and supply all pertinent information concerning the application. The superintendent, principal, and counselor will determine whether to recommend the approval or denial of the application. The superintendent will submit the recommendation to the board.
